2011 RULES, REGULATIONS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The Gladwin County Fair Association reserves the right to reject any entry for just cause. Entries will be eliminated when present facilities are exhausted.
2. Exhibitors assume all risk of exhibiting livestock and all other articles. Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of all exhibits but in no case will the Fairboard be responsible for the loss or injury to an exhibit.
3. The superintendent of each department has the authority to arrange for and assign space for each exhibitor and to maintain order in the department. All stalls, pens and other exhibits shall be kept clean, neat and in show order. Failure to do so may necessitate forfeiture of awards. Reclassification will be done only by superintendent. The superintendents are acting on behalf of the Gladwin County Fair Association's Directors and their job is to ensure that the policies of the Fair are followed.
4. Children under the chronological age of 5 years old will not be allowed to exhibit or show at the Gladwin County Fair.
5. CLOVERBUDS -Children chronological ages of 5 years through 6 years old will be allowed to show when there is a age class for them, but in non-competitive classes only. Cloverbud children chronological ages of 7 years through 8 years old will be allowed to show when there is a age class for them, but in non-competitive classes only. They may borrow animals to show. No premiums will be awarded. Adults must be in immediate supervision with them. The 4-H Cloverbuds' guidelines for showing will be followed when showing animals in Open Class. Cloverbuds ages 5 & 6 will not be allowed to show any large animal species except horses.
6. All feed and equipment must be brought in before 9 AM each day. Driving down pavement after 9 a.m. is not allowed.
7. Disregard of any rules by exhibitors or concessionaires and merchants will necessitate forfeiture of rewards and privileges.
8. PROTEST /APPEALS/COMPLAINTS-An exhibitors compelled to bring a complaint regarding conflict of interest of the judge, disqualification of an exhibit or exhibitor; exhibitor. Group leader or superintendent's behavior, or eligibility of an exhibit shall make a formal protest in writing to the Fair Board no later than ten day following the end of the fair. Any protest must be in the hands of the Fair Secretary before the 10 days, and a \$25.00 fee must accompany any signed complaint turned in and if it is a legitimate complaint, your money will be refunded. The Resolution Committee will review within three days of receiving the complaint, will investigate all evidence and issue a notice of findings and recommended action on this complaint.
Notification will be made to the exhibitor filing the complaint (not on judging results) that they may make an appeal to the Department of Agriculture within 45 days of filing the initial complaint if the exhibitor is not satisfied with the Fair Association's action. The Dept. of Agriculture. shall have 60 days after the receipt of an appropriately filed appeal to investigate the complaint, and shall issue a finding of fact and notice of action and any recommended actions for the Fair Association.
9. The Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard to them.
10. The 4-H/FFA Auctions are governed by the rules and regulations set up by the Livestock Advisory Board & the Small Animal Association.
11. UNETHICAL BEHAVIOR If, for an incident of unethical behavior, such as fraud or deception or improper conduct has been practiced or attempted at the Gladwin Co. Fair, these matters will be directly policed by the Barn Superintendents. In the event that such an activity takes place, the Resolution Committee and a County Agent from the Extension Office shall review the incident and determine at that time what needs to be done. This will take place the day the complaint is filed. If it is found that the questionable act was indeed unethical, the person's responsible for that activity and their animal(s) or exhibits shall be immediately removed from fairgrounds property. Determination by the Board of Directors shall be final.
12. Any animal exhibited at the Gladwin County Fair may be, randomly or by written request, drug tested. All samples will be handled in accordance with the Dept. of Agriculture guidelines.
13. Sale of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, and drugs is forbidden on the fairgrounds and campgrounds by order of the Board of Directors.
14. No alcoholic beverages are permitted outside of the designated-numbered camp grounds (does not include grove camping). Any infractions of the Fairboard rules due to consuming alcohol/drugs shall result in a first warning. Any second infraction shall mean ejection from the Fairgrounds and the campgrounds. And, the matter shall be turned over to the Sheriff's Department for enforcement. Further camping permits will be with held. Camping fees will be forfeited and no refunds will be made.

15. Underage drinking will not be tolerated. Infractions caused by consuming alcohol or drugs are a violation of the 4-H member or leader Code of Conduct adopted by the Gladwin County 4-H Leaders Council.
16. NO bikes on fairgrounds, midway and around barns.
17. NO motorized vehicles in grove.
18. No person under the age of 18 will be permitted on Fairgrounds after 12 midnight unless under the direct supervision of a responsible adult. There will be no exception to this rule.
19. All off road vehicles, used anywhere on the grounds, must have a permit from the office. Determination of physical need will be made by the Resolution Committee. Persons under age 18 will not be given a permit. Drivers must be licensed. File your request with campsite registration.
20. No guns will be allowed on fair grounds property.

The Gladwin County Fair Association management has the right to subject any animal shown at this fair to drug or residue testing randomly or by show cause. Upon a positive confirmation forfeiture of all rewards, and trophies will be the penalty. The expense for drug testing shall go to the person owning the animal if the test results show proof of improper use of drugs.

Livestock Sample Collection Procedures

Performed by a Veterinarian/authorized representative

Prior to the Fair

1. Request the animal drug testing supplies from the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Laboratory Division, at least thirty days prior to the event. The request must be made by mail or fax (517) 337-5094. For questions or information contact Gina Dewitt, Equine Drug Testing Section at (517) 203-1356 or (517) 337-5082.

NOTE: The fair has legal authority to require drug testing under the Animal Industry Act, Act 466 of 1988, as amended, in Section 40(3): "A fair, exhibition, exposition, or show authority may require additional testing or vaccination of animals before entry and during the fair, exhibition, exposition or show."

At the Fair

1. Verify the animal you are about to test by identify any tattoos, ear tags or ear notches that are on the animal. Whenever possible use USDA official identification vs. farm identification. Be sure to include this information on the "Sample Tag".
2. Present the container for examination to the animal representative/exhibitor, making sure to verify with the animal representative that the security seal has not been previously broken. If the sample container is rejected for any reason, use another container and return the defective one to the laboratory.

Note: The animal representative must remain with the animal at all times during the sample collection process.

3. Record the seal # in the top right box of the Sample Transmittal Packing List.

4. Open the container by pressing upward on the tab marked open, breaking the seal.
5. Place the container in the catching stick; fold the lid back and anchor it under the metal finger welded onto the handle.
6. If a urine sample can not be obtained, a Michigan Licensed Veterinarian /Veterinarian Technician may collect five tubes of blood from the animal. Each tube of blood must be identified with one of the six small sticker tags provided on the "Sample Tag". Place the five labeled blood tubes inside a plastic sample container and seal as described below.
7. After collecting the sample, close the lid and snap it completely shut. Loop the barbed plastic strip on the sample container through the two holes in the container tabs and pull snug. Apply a short piece of evidence tape across the protruding end of the plastic barbed strip and also across the lid and down sides of the container.
9. Complete the information on a "Sample Tag" substituting the name of the fair for "Track", the name of the animal (Grand Champion Steer, Reserve Champion Swine, etc.) for "Horse" and the ear tag number or other unique identification number for "Tattoo". After the animal representative has watched the sample collection and sealing, they must sign under "Witness" on the sample tag. The person collecting the sample must sign under the "Sampled By" on the "Sample Tag."
10. Place one completed large sticker tag from the top of the "Sample Tag" on the top of the sample container over the evidence tape and the other completed large sticker tag on the side of the container. The remaining portion of the completed "Sample Tag" must be kept and NOT returned to the lab.
11. Lock the sealed and labeled sample container in a metal can.

Note: Once the can is locked it can not be opened until it reaches the lab.

12. Samples must be held secure and cold until transferred to the laboratory.

Note: Urine may be frozen, blood must be kept refrigerated and never be frozen.

13. Any discarded needles should be placed in an approved "Sharps" container by the veterinarian/veterinarian technician.
14. When all sample collection has been completed, fill out the "Sample Transmittal Packing List." The packing list must identify the tag number of all samples included in the case. Enclose the completed "Sample Transmittal Packing List," any unused supplies and regenerated/refrozen freezer packs in the case and seal it with the provided intact case seal.

After Sample Collection is Completed

1. Transport samples to the lab either in person or by overnight express. Arrange samples to arrive at the lab during normal business hours (7:30 am- 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday). The lab is located on the campus of Michigan State University at: 1615 South Harrison Road, East Lansing, MI 48823.
2. Collect and retain signed Animal Certification Forms and the remaining portion of the completed "Sample tag".

ENTRIES

1. Exhibitors must be pre-registered. Use great care filling out entry forms. Incomplete forms cannot be accepted. Birth dates of children must be on form.
2. 4-H Coggins test papers must be turned in on May 1st and open class, sent with entry forms.
3. All animals on grounds must be entered in a class.
4. All still exhibits must be the product of the exhibitor.
5. Only one free pass per exhibiting family will be given out.

OPEN CLASS ENTRIES

1. Open Class animal entries must be made and turned into Fair Office in all departments by June 20, by 4:00 PM. Exhibits will be rejected after this date. Open class still exhibits, (crafts, foods, etc.) must pre-register entries by July 5, 2011 by 4:30 PM. LATE ENTRIES WILL BE NOT BE ACCEPTED.
2. All still exhibits must be in place by 3:00 p.m., Sunday, July 10, 2011. Fresh baked foods and cut flowers must be in before 9 AM on Monday. Flowers must be replaced on Wednesday if wilted.
3. No livestock accepted on the grounds before 6 p.m. on Saturday, July 9, 2011.
4. Animals exhibited in open class may not leave early unless excused by a veterinarian. This includes 4-H entries shown in open class.

4-H ENTRIES

1. 4-H/FFA and Cloverbud pre-registrations must be turned in to the Fair Office by 4:00 PM on June 20, 2011.
2. 4-H exhibitors must be enrolled in their projects by Feb. 1 for all other projects. Gladwin County 4-H project guidelines for each project must be followed.
3. Market class animals must be owned by the exhibitor.
4. The Gladwin County Fair Association's Board of Directors will stand behind the Project Guidelines set forth by the Gladwin 4-H and FFA.

ADMISSIONS AND FEES

MEMBERSHIP TO FAIR ASSOCIATION

\$15.00 per person and members are entitled to vote for directors of the Fairboard at the annual meeting. Fee includes one parking pass for fair week.

1. **PARKING** -\$5.00 per car/per day or week passes for \$20.00 may be purchased at office on or after June 1, 2011 from 9 AM to 4 PM. daily.

2. **CAMPING** - \$80.00 electric & water for any unit. \$40.00 primitive.

3. **NO CAMPING BEFORE 3:00 PM, Saturday, JULY 9. You will be charged for an extra day before 3 PM.**

Registration forms are available at www.gladwinfair.org or at the fair office.

One pass will be given out for a campsite and another may be purchased for \$10.

Must have parking permit for campgrounds.

White hoses must be used for camp water for drinking.

Pets making excessive noise will not be allowed to stay on grounds.

Reservation information at 426-2311. You must register with the superintendent of camping at camp station before parking on spaces. Set up camper times Saturday between 3PM & 8 PM on Saturday, or after 9 AM on Sunday.

See camp rules before bringing in extra equipment. **QUADS OR MOTORCYCLES ARE NOT ALLOWED IN CAMPGROUNDS DURING FAIR WEEK.** All off road vehicles, used anywhere on the grounds, must have a permit from the office. Determination of physical need will be made by the Resolution Committee. Persons under age 18 will not be given a permit. Drivers must be licensed. File request with campsite registration.

3. **ENTRY FEES AND STALL FEES** are listed under individual departments.

4. Guns will not be allowed on fairgrounds.

JUDGES

1. Judges are asked to keep in mind that the exhibits are not intended to be displays of professional talents but are to be considered as competitive efforts by amateurs trying to do a good job. Judges should not base consideration on predetermined standards of another show.

2. Judges shall not have a supervisory role at the fair or have an ongoing and direct relationship with any participating exhibitor or employee in the class or classes where they are requested to serve as a judge.

3. Judges will in no case award a premium where there is no merit, though there may be no competition; and in case of partial merit, second money may be awarded though no first premium is given, or none at all as the judge may deem worthy.

4. Best of Show will be awarded on Blue Ribbons only.

6. **CLOVERBUDS** – Children between ages of 5 through 8 years will not be put in competitive or pressure situation. They will be interviewed by a caring person who will visit with each member about their project. They are to be accepted as they are with encouragement and compliments. Each member will receive a participation award.

RELEASE

1. Animals will be released between 6:00 a.m. and 11 a.m., on Sunday morning. All other articles in the 4-H and Open Class buildings and Commercial buildings will be released between 8:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Saturday evening or Monday from 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. Loading must be done from the road on Saturday evening.
2. All entries must be picked up by the close of the fair and the area used must be cleaned properly or an automatic loss of premiums. Buildings will be open on Monday the following week from 9AM until 4PM for pick up.
3. Any animal or exhibit removed before the time specified for release will forfeit premiums, ribbons and all awards.
4. Any commercial exhibitor not observing release rules may be subject to refusal of privilege to exhibit in the future.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Dogs must be confined or on leashes when being exercised. Dogs not allowed in animal barns.
2. If at all possible return your stock trailers and trucks to your home during fair week. **DO NOT PARK STOCK TRAILERS IN CAMPGROUNDS.**
3. Vehicles may NOT be left parked on grounds during the week.
4. "NO PARKING" will be enforced on State Street at 12 noon July 12, 2010.
5. North gate of fairgrounds will close at 8:00 a.m. Must use back entrance for delivery until 11AM. **No delivery or traffic after that time.**
6. Animals on exhibit must be in good health as required in Michigan Department of Agriculture Regulation Numbers 117 and 113 and Act 181, P.A. 1919, as amended and Act 466 of 1988.
ALL HORSES MUST SHOW PROOF OF A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST WITHIN THE CURRENT CALENDAR YEAR IN ORDER TO EXHIBIT.
ALL BEEF, DAIRY, DAIRY FEEDER STEERS, AND GOATS NEED TO SHOW PROOF OF A NEGATIVE TB TEST, AND BE PROPERLY IDENTIFIED AS SUCH.
ALL SHEEP AND GOATS WILL NEED PROPER IDENTIFICATION AND HEALTH CERTIFICATES ACCORDING TO THE SCRAPIES ERADICATION RULES. ALL SWINE WILL FOLLOW CURRENT STATE REQUIREMENTS.
POULTRY MUST HAVE BEEN TESTED FOR PULLORUM AND MUST TURN IN PAPER-WORK TO SUPERINTENDENT BEFORE BIRDS ARE TAKEN TO BARN.

DO NOT UNLOAD ANY ANIMALS UNTIL THE SUPERINTENDENT HAS CHECKED THE PAPERWORK AND IDENTIFICATION PAPERS.

ALL CATTLE OLDER THAN 6 MONTHS, MUST HAVE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING BEFORE THEY CAN BE UNLOADED FROM THEIR TRAILER FOR EXHIBITION.

1. MUST ORIGINATE DIRECTLY FROM A HERD THAT HAS HAD A WHOLE-HERD TEST WITHIN 12 MONTHS PRIOR TO THE EXHIBITION. 2. ORIGINATE DIRECTLY FROM A TB-FREE ACCREDITED HERD AND CAN PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION. 3. HAVE A NEGATIVE OFFICIAL TEST FOR BOVINE TB WITHIN 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE FAIR.
2. BULLS OVER 12 MONTHS OLD MUST HAVE A RING IN THEIR NOSE.

No one under age 9 can show any bull.

Stalls must be cleaned before leaving grounds or awards will be forfeited.

The following information will be helpful in determining an animal's proper classification.

- Junior Heifer Calf..... Born 3/1/11 to 7/1/11
- Junior Bull Calf Born 1/1/11 to 7/1/11
- Int. Heifer Calf..... Born 12/1/10 to 2/29/11

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR 4-H/FFA.

BARN AGREEMENTS MUST BE SIGNED AND TURNED IN AT THIS TIME.

1. All exhibitors must be currently enrolled in a Gladwin County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter by Feb. 1, 2011 except market steer exhibitors by Jan.6, 2011. Gladwin County 4-H project guidelines for each project must be followed. See fair age guidelines for showing.
2. If 4-H Cloverbud members are to have direct involvement with an animal, the contact must take place under the direct supervision of a responsible parent or adult/teen volunteer. 5-8 year olds may be involved with an animal on a halter or lead, unless they (7 & 8 year olds) are showing horses. They must be directly supported by a parent or an adult/teen volunteer who is on the grounds holding the animal's halter or lead.
3. Cloverbud children (5 & 8 years old) will be allowed to show someone else's animal by pre-arrangement with the other exhibitor.. Other than this exception, no animal is permitted to be shown by more than one exhibitor.
4. Only one entry per exhibitor per class.
5. Entries will be placed in A, B, or C groups (Danish System) and receive corresponding ribbons and premiums, unless otherwise stated.
6. Ribbons will be awarded in all classes, unless otherwise specified.
7. 4-H and FFA members desiring to enter in Open Class must have a separate entry form.
8. 4-H & FFA Livestock, Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goat members who wish to enter their animals in Open Classes must have different animals and Open Class form turned in to the fair office by June 20.
9. 4-H & FFA members must exhibit current year's work and projects. Project cards will be required on all still exhibits. For collections which must be added to annually, one third should be new. Entomology and rocks must be enlarged according to 4-H guidelines.
10. All exhibits must be in place by noon Monday, opening day of the fair, unless otherwise specified. No livestock accepted on the grounds before 6:00 p.m. Saturday, the day preceding opening day.

UNETHICAL BEHAVIOR - DRUG TEST - HEALTH AND SANITATION

12. Any violation of the following rule will automatically result in disqualification. The use of any drug or chemical compound that is not approved by the Food and Drug Administration for use in meat animals is prohibited. The illegal administration of approved drugs and compounds is also prohibited. All animals entered in the Youth Department are subject to blood, urine and tissue test by the Gladwin County Fair Association, FDA and USDA for illegal substances and substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the USDA, the Food and Drug Administration, the Food Animal Residue Avoidance Databank and Environmental Protection Agency. A positive test will result in disqualification. The exhibitor shall assume full responsibility for any violation of regulations related to drugs and medication to include withdrawal times and the condemnation of carcasses due to drug rule/regulation violation. This includes forfeiture of all premiums/moneys will be withheld until test have been completed. A positive result will result in exhibitor paying all testing fees.
13. If in the year prior to the Gladwin Co. 4-H /FFA Livestock Sale held at the Gladwin Co. Fair, a registered 4-H/FFA member of Gladwin County has sold a market steer, market lamb, market swine, or any combination of these animals, at any other county fair livestock sale, this member will not be allowed to sell at the Gladwin Co. 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale held at the Gladwin Co. Fair that year.
 - a. Any beef, sheep, or swine shown by this member will be exhibited in the No Sale Class as established in the Gladwin Fairboard Rules.
 - b. The member will not be allowed to post a sign of the private sale of his/her animal in the barn until after the Livestock Sale. The selling price cannot be posted.
 - c. If it is found that a member has violated this rule within the year prior to the Gladwin County 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale and sold at the Gladwin County 4-H/FFA sale this member will be disqualified from the sale the next year. See Livestock Advisory rules for clarification.
15. Large livestock animals will be released between 6:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
16. Small Auction animals will be at will be released at 6:00 p.m. Saturday.

17. Premiums shall be forfeited if animals, stalls, pens, cages are not kept clean daily and clean-up not completed at the end of the fair, as determined by department supervisors.
18. Parents, leaders and members are responsible for Clean-up on Sunday after the fair.
19. Incidence of unethical behavior will not be tolerated at the Gladwin County Fair. These matters will be directly policed by the Barn Superintendents. In the event that such an activity takes place, the Resolution Committee and a County Agent from the MSU Extension Office shall review the incident, and determine at that time what needs to be done. If it is found that the questionable act was indeed unethical, the person's responsible for that activity and the animal or animal's involved, shall be immediately removed from fairgrounds property.
20. Superintendents have the right to release sick or unkempt animals.
21. **Any animal brought to the fair must be entered in a class.**
22. Each member must show their own animal in a showmanship class (except Cloverbuds, see above rule #3).
23. Specific rules posted in barns must be strictly adhered to ...!
24. No "BEST OF SHOW" awarded where 4 or less entries, unless the judge deems it of quality for the award.
25. The showmanship animal must be entered and shown in at least one other age class by the member, except animals brought by a Cloverbud member.
26. Each exhibitor can only show one animal per division in showmanship.
27. In the Horse, Beef, Sheep & Swine division there will be a run off between each age division winner per species to represent that species in overall showmanship. There will be no trophies or ribbons for the run-off.
28. Members can only compete in one overall showmanship section, large or small.
29. Fair board does not set rules or govern the livestock auctions. The rules are set up by the Advisory Boards for each auction.
30. Exhibitors must be able to control their animal at all times. Animals will be sent home if uncontrollable. The Superintendents and the Resolution Committee will review all cases.
31. Cloverbud exhibitors will enter the show ring. They will be introduced. They should tell their name, parents name, club name, and how long they have been involved in 4-H. After the introduction, they will then move into an Obstacle course that will consist of barrels and a pen. This class will take place immediately following the market class for each species.
32. Project guidelines for all exhibits set by the Gladwin 4-H/FFA must be followed.
33. Market Record books allowed only if the animal is shown at the fair.
34. Classes may be combined if a low number of entries in a class. No supreme champion given if there is no competition.

SECTION C - AIR PELLET

Air (pellet) rifle equipment:

1. Rifles must be 0.177 Cal. Single shot rifles are preferred. Any rifle with a magazine or clip must be modified to single shot.
2. Only 0.177 matched grade (flat face) pellets will be used.
3. For field air rifles: The rifle must be able to be shot single fire. Sights must be open or peep without micrometer adjustments (slide or screw adjustable).
NO telescopic sights, palm rests or adjustable butt plates are permitted. Slings are not allowed. The rifle must not weigh more than 6.5 lbs. or have a barrel larger than 3/4 inches in muzzle.
4. Ordinary sports or casual clothing must be worn. NO padded or unusually heavy clothing or braces, including elastic bandages, may be worn except by handicapped shooters with permission of the Tournament director.
5. Shooters must bring their own mats, blankets, or ground cloths to use, subject to the inspection and approval of range officer.

Targets, rules and course of fire and eligibility

1. Targets will be up to the discretion of shooting sports leaders.
2. Three positions (one target each): prone, kneeling, and standing at the distance of 10 meters.
3. Course of fire: 10 shots per target within 10 minutes.
4. Competition will be on a 10 meter range.

Michigan 4-H Shooting Sports rules will be followed. Contestants must have successfully completed a DNR Hunter Safety Program in order to participate.

Small-bore Equipment Guidelines:

Any .22 caliber rim-fire rifle (no .22 Magnum rifles) single shot rifles preferred. Rifle weight may not exceed 7.5 pounds. Barrel diameter may not exceed 3/4 of an inch at the muzzle. Trigger pull must be 2 pounds or more. Sights may be open or peep style only. The front sight must be permanently mounted, not capable of changing inserts. The rear sight must not be capable of micrometer adjustment. No telescopic sights, slings, palm rests, adjustable butt plates or specialized shooting coats, pants, shoes, etc. are permitted. Only rim-fire .22 "short", "long", or "long rifle" ammunition will be allowed. Participants should bring their own shooting mats, blankets or ground cloths to use. All are subject to inspection and acceptance by the range officer.

SHOTGUN EQUIPMENT

Eye Protection: All shooters (4-H members) and other persons on or in the immediate vicinity of each shooting field, including Certified Shotgun Instructors, 4-H leaders, 4-H volunteers, and any spectators must wear adequate eye protection (glasses or goggles). The equipment MUST cover both eyes. Normal corrective lenses constructed of impact resistant materials may be used.

Ear Protection: Adequate ear protection must be used by all shooters, 4-H Instructors, 4-H volunteers, 4-H leaders, and spectators on the shooting fields during live firing. Both earplugs and ear muffs are acceptable.

Shotguns: All current 4-H shotgun events permit the use of any shotgun 12 gauge or smaller (20 gauge, 410), however, 12 gauge is recommended. The shotgun MUST have the gauge and the maximum length of the load, stamped on the barrel. There are no limitations on action types. Slide action or semi-automatic actions do NOT have to have the magazines plugged, but in no case shall the gun be loaded with more than two shells for double trap and skeet and no more than one shell for single trap, at any 4-H shotgun event. Release triggers are prohibited. Full or modified chokes need to be used in the shotgun muzzle. All guns brought to the range must be in a case, unloaded, with actions open. All guns are to be inspected by the 4-H volunteers. Gun "fit" for the shooter will be determined by the Certified 4-H shotgun instructor.

Ammunition: All ammunition may be used as long as it does not exceed the length stamped on the Shotgun barrel.

Hand loaded ammunition may be used; however, it must be inspected by the 4-H volunteer. No Magnum Loads.

Age Requirements: All 4-H participants must be 12 to 19 years old as of January 1st of the 4-H year.

Target, rules and course of fire:

1. Targets will be up to the discretion of the Shooting Sports instructor.
2. Course of fire: 10 shots at 10 trap targets for single trap events. 20 shots at 20 trap targets for double trap events. Total of 30 shots and 30 traps.
3. "Chipping" a trap target during fire is considered a hit.
4. Scoring is decided by the scorekeeper and all decisions are final.

The trap thrower will be up to 20 yards to the left or the right of the shooter and on the same plain, as outlined by the Amateur Trap Association guidelines. Shooter must show use of "follow through" abilities, as well as gun control. Ten traps will be thrown away and across from the shooter.

Participants will be shooting 3-Position (Standing, Kneeling/Sitting, Prone). They will be shooting 2 shots per bull for a total of 30 shots to be scored. Unless specified above, all rules will be according to the current NRA Junior Rifle (rule 3.4) and provisional Rules for Light Rifle Competition, Small-bore Rifle Competition Rules. Scoring is up to the discretion of the scorekeepers.
